

 - a) Clingy, luscious, misunderstood. Ivy has long been accused of strangling trees, but it doesn't harm the tree at all, and even supports at least 50 species of wildlife.
- 2) Dave Dawson (FOWP Environmental Adviser).
 - a) Many species of bat, bird and insect are known to use the ivy in the wood for nectar, food and shelter. Killing it has caused significant harm.
